



SCHOOL PROFILE

Rank

MDQ Academy does not rank the student body, but MDQ Academy does identify the valedictorian, and salutatorian. The identification of the valedictorian and salutatorian is based on a holistic review process that includes academic excellence, weighted GPA, AP exam results, AP courses taken, SAT/ACT scores, essay, and community service. Valedictorian and salutatorian candidates must complete at least three years of academic work at MDQ Academy to be considered.

GPA Calculation

GPA is computed using the below weighted quality points, beginning with any high school credit taken in 8th grade and all credit attempted in grades 9 through 12 in all subjects whether passed or failed. All transfer credit, credit by exam, and dual credit, that is accepted as credit by MDQ Academy, is included in the GPA computation. MDQ Academy uses a 5.0 weighted GPA scale where AP/Pre AP/Honors/Dual Credit courses are weighted. For students who transfer into MDQ Academy and took an AP course where a student received a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP exam will receive 2 additional points. All MDQ Academy AP courses will receive an additional GPA point. Grade level, modified, credit by exam and transfer credits are unweighted as outlined below. MDQ Academy will also provide an unweighted 4.0 GPA score as well as the weighted score for the convenience of universities only.

Community

The MDQ Academy campus serves the educational needs of students in Suffolk Count Long Island, NY. MDQ Academy is the only Islamic school in Suffolk county. The campus includes a diversified socio-economic base with 30% of the student population qualifying and receiving financial aid. The student body is culturally diverse with a large population of Arabs, South Asians, Asians, African Americans, Hispanic's, Caucasians, and students who identify as multiracial. Student populations breakdowns include: 48% Asian, 20% White, 8% Hispanic, 7% African Americans, and 17% identifying as Multiracial.

School

Currently, the campus consists of one high school, one middle school, and one elementary school with a Kg-5, 6-8 and 9-12 grade-level configurations. The campus includes one licensed accredited child care facility on site that serves Pre-K I and Pre-K II. MDQ Academy High School is a comprehensive four-year private school enrolling on average 50 students in grades 9 through 12. The school was established and opened their doors in the fall of 2003 and will graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2017. MDQ Academy is accredited by New York State Board of Education (BEDS Code # 580501995496) and has been recommended for AdvancedEd accreditation by Advanced Ed. MDQ Academy holds membership in the College Board CEEB# 331182, Duke Tip program, the National Honor Society, among others.

Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule. On average eight (8) to ten (10) credits per semester is the maximum course load; students take two 90-minute block schedules, and six 45-minute class schedule. Students attend 2 block classes and the regular class daily. Block classes are year-long; each block meets every day. We follow a semester report card system. MDQ Academy follows the State of New York Educational Standards and Common Core standards. MDQ Academy conducts the following standardized exams which include, Regents, ITBS (IOWA), I-Ready, PSAT, and AP exams. Arabic, Quranic Studies and Theology-Islamic Studies classes are offered K-12. MDQ Academy offers Regular, Honors, Pre-AP and AP courses.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Students are encouraged to take a rigorous course load of AP classes and we believe in AP for all. This academic year of 2015-2016 is the first year that AP and Pre-AP courses were offered at MDQ Academy.

AP courses are offered in English language, English Literature, U.S. History, U.S. Government, Biology, Economics, and Calculus. AP English Language, U.S. History and Biology are offered in 11th grade. AP Government, Economics and Calculus are offered in 12th grade. AP Psychology, AP Statistics, and AP Spanish are offered in 11th and 12th grade. AP is an open enrollment program, following the methodology of AP for all, and we continue to add AP courses annually.

2-3 Pre-AP classes were offered this academic year in 9th and 10th grade.

Transcripts

Final grades will be posted to the transcript after graduation in May. Mid-year grades will be posted to the transcript in January. Honorable mentions (Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be identified in January). Current report card grades will be noted when possible on the transcript any time before the above mentioned months.
